Pohang, where HGU is located, is known as a sea port city and a high-tech industrial city.



Seoul(Capital) - Pohang  
: 2.5hours by train  
: 4hours by bus

Busan(2nd city) - Pohang  
: 1.5hours by bus



## Cost of Living in Pohang, Rep. of Korea

Health Insurance fee= 100,000 KRW (\$100)  
Transportation fee from Seoul(Airport) to HGU  
= 40,000~80,000 KRW (\$40~80)  
Textbook= 30,000~50,000KRW per book (\$30)  
Meal in school cafeteria= 3,000~5,000 KRW (\$3~5)  
Cost of living per month= 250,000~ KRW (\$250~)
